

April 2009: Arlington Acquires Rights to Columbus Facility with Rail Access
Sets Sights on Future Expansion

Arlington Energy President Ernie Malas announced this month that the Company has acquired rights to a Columbus commercial facility with rail access. The Company's first plant is located in Mansfield, Ohio, and is in the midst of a major equipment upgrade project. The upgrade will double the Mansfield plant's capacity from 5 mgy (million gallons per year) to 10 mgy. Arlington is looking to build a 15mg capacity plant at the Columbus facility.

"Rail transportation becomes necessary when you go over 10mg, and a 15mg plant maximizes the advantage of the Small Producer Tax Credit, so this will be an ideal situation." said Malas. The Small Producer Tax Credit provides \$.10 per gallon Federal tax credit for biodiesel producers up to 15mg.

"We've been in touch with City leaders and potential investors about the Columbus facility, and we're seeing strong interest from both in a Columbus biodiesel project," said Malas. "As soon as the Mansfield project completes the grant application cycle and investor funding, we should be able to roll right on to doing the same for the Columbus plant."
