

**June 2009: Arlington Energy China Connection Leads to Jatropha Project Opportunity** Malas heading to Guang Xi Province to represent Arlington

Arlington Energy entered the biodiesel business in 2007, and the company is wasting no time in leveraging their start-up experience to expand their business. Arlington Principal Robert "B.J." Scheurger has a "day job" as an international trade attorney, which led to a biodiesel opportunity for Arlington in China. Bei Bu Investment Corporation of Guang Xi province (China's southernmost province, which borders Viet Nam) has already begun planting an extensive Jatropha plantation to provide a renewable source of plants needed for biodiesel production. Jatropha, a non-food fruit with high quality oil seed content, has emerged worldwide as one of the more promising biofuel feedstock crops.

Bei Bu Investment Corp. has a five-year project plan which includes building a 15 mgy (million gallons per year) biodiesel plant at start-up, and increasing the biodiesel capacity in stages, up to 100 mgy. Arlington will represent US equipment manufacturers in developing a biodiesel production facility for the project.

"This is an exciting opportunity for Arlington, for our Ohio partners, and for the US alternative energy industry," said Ernie Malas, Arlington's President. "B.J. has done a great job getting us to this point in the deal, and we'd like nothing better than to lend our expertise, and to be part of sending US-manufactured equipment to this leading-edge project in Guang Xi Province."
